5. Lower Cache Creek Feasibility Study – Status Update
 - a. Finalizing Environmental Impact Report (EIR)
 - i. Planning to bring to City Council on February 16th.
 - ii. Final EIR to be uploaded to City website February 5th.
 - b. Discussion of any questions or comments Committee has on previous meeting discussion of master responses

6. Lower Cache Creek Feasibility Study – Status Update
 - a. Final Feasibility Report and Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) submit to Corps HQ on February 1, 2021
 - i. Costs are being updated, benefit cost ratio (BCR) expected in range of 2.1
 - b. Chief's report is anticipated June 30, 2021
 - c. Chief's report allows for the project to be authorized in next Water Resources Development Act (WRDA).
 - d. After the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil Works) approves the report and submits it to the Office of Management and Budget, the Corps can request funding to start PED which will take 2-3 years to complete
 - e. Once the first set of plans and specifications are completed, project can be considered for construction funding

7. Next Advisory Committee Meeting – Early 2022. Focus will be on providing feedback on a draft of the City's plan to fund the local share of the project.
