What goes in the Trash?

Food Packaging

YES

Plastic wrap and bags
Plastic straws
Foam containers or trays
Plastic utensils
Sauce packets or cups
Plastic candy or chip wrappers
Dirty or full recyclable items
Produce stickers or labels
Rubber bands

Cartons (milk, nut milk, broth, etc.)
Clean plastic containers (#1-7)
Clean glass jars or bottles
Metal cans or small scrap
Napkins
Compostable paper plates
Compostable packaging
Food scraps

Household Goods

YES

LED or incandescent light bulbs
Broken plates or glasses
Ceramics
Garden hoses
Holiday lights

CFL Light bulbs
Household chemicals or cleaners
Batteries

Personal Care

YES

Empty squeeze tubes (lotion, toothpaste, etc.)
Diapers
Feminine care products
Pump bottle tops
Manual toothbrushes & floss
Gloves, hair nets, and other PPE

Medications (prescription and over-the-counter)
Sharps
Electric toothbrushes or devices
Clean & empty plastic bottles

Other

Dirt and soil
Rocks and gravel
Pet waste
Bubble wrap & mailers
Packing peanuts
Plastic tape
Pens, markers, pencils.

Yard Waste
Electronic waste
Cardboard or paper

Rules:

- Hazardous waste is not allowed in the trash
- Residents may contact WM to schedule a pickup through the At Your Door program by calling (800) 449-7587 or bring items to the Yolo County Landfill during Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) hours.
- Businesses must call (800) 207-8222 to schedule an appointment for proper hazardous waste disposal.
- Lids on carts/bins must close completely.
