



MEDICARE WORKSHOP AND ONE-ON-ONE ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FROM HICAP DURING ANNUAL OPEN ENROLLMENT

A free, virtual workshop to help Medicare enrollees understand drug plans and Medicare Advantage plans available in Yolo County for 2026 is scheduled for **Monday, October 27 from 1:00-2:00 pm**. Woodland Senior Center is hosting a group viewing of the workshop, which may also be viewed from home via Zoom. A question and answer period will follow from 2:00-3:00 pm. The workshop is presented by the Yolo County Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program (HICAP), a special project of the non-profit Legal Services of Northern California.

The workshop will provide helpful information needed for the Medicare's annual open enrollment period, October 15 through December 7, 2025. This is one of the few times Medicare beneficiaries can change, enroll into, or dis-enroll from a Medicare Part D drug plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan. The workshop will focus on changes to Medicare and options available to Yolo County residents for 2026.

No registration is required to attend the workshop at the senior center or at home. For viewing at home, individuals may access the online workshop at: www.HICAPservices.net/events. After the workshop, a recording of it will be available at: www.HICAPservices.net/events.

In addition to the workshop, HICAP provides **one-on-one assistance** to Medicare recipients. **HICAP Medicare Worksheets** are available for pick up at the Woodland Senior Center or by calling (916) 376-8915. After filling in the worksheet with basic information and a list of your prescriptions, you'll secure it in an envelope and drop it in the mail (or the Senior Center can mail it for you). Once received, a certified HICAP counselor will review the information, research your options and report back to you on their findings. You will then have the information needed to make a good Medicare choice for 2026.

As an alternative, **in-person and phone appointments** with a HICAP counselor are available. In-person appointments are at Woodland Senior Center and four other Yolo County locations. To schedule, call (916) 376-8915. Appointments are limited and fill fast.

Medicare beneficiaries should be wary of media promotions about specific benefits of Medicare Advantage plans. **Television ads and mailers** can be very misleading and the benefits being promoted may not be included in the plans offered in Yolo County. In addition, brokers may promote only some of the plans you have a right to enroll in.

HICAP provides unbiased Medicare information and is administered by the CA Dept. of Aging.

This month, we are highlighting “*The Colorado Rockies*” trip. (B) means breakfast is included, (L) means lunch is included, (D) means dinner is included. Day 1: Friday, August 7, 2026: Denver, Colorado - Adventure awaits as you explore the towering peaks and rolling meadows of Colorado. As traveler’s arrival times vary greatly, we have no group activities planned during the day. This tour (which features four national parks) opens in the “Mile High City” of Denver where you will gather for a welcome dinner with your fellow travelers. (D)

Day 2: Saturday, August 8, 2026: Denver - Rocky Mountain National Park - Denver - Travel through Boulder, a scenic university town known for its iconic landmark... the striking, reddish-brown foothills known as the Flatirons. Stop in Estes Park, a mountain resort town and home of the Stanley Hotel, the inspiration for Stephen King’s *The Shining*. Your adventure in Rocky Mountain National Park starts on the Trail Ridge Road, the highest paved, continuous highway in North America. It’s a drive that should be on everybody’s bucket list. At Rainbow Curve, marvel at the majestic mountains that stand in contrast to deep, rugged canyons. Later, return to Denver for a free evening in this dynamic city. (B)

Day 3: Sunday, August 9, 2026: Denver - Colorado National Monument - Grand Junction - The spectacular Rocky Mountains are your traveling companion. Make a scenic drive from Denver to Grand Junction, passing through many of Colorado’s famous ski resorts. This journey also takes you to one of the grand landscapes of the American West – Colorado National Monument. Continue along the monument’s historic Rim Rock Drive to see a colorful panorama of deep, sheer-sided canyons and high rock towers. Gather for dinner at a favorite local hangout in Grand Junction, a town that attracts outdoorsmen, foodies and all manner of free spirits. (B, D)

Day 4: Monday, August 10, 2026 Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park - Grand Junction - Today, venture to another amazing national park – Colorado’s own “Grand Canyon”! Marvel at the steep-walled gorge and dramatic views of Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park while travelling along its South Rim. Pause at one of the scenic viewpoints to soak in this stunning wilderness of rock, water, and sky. Enjoy a picnic lunch overlooking some of the steepest and oldest rock walls in North America, carved over 2 million years by the Gunnison River. Perhaps you’ll even spot a peregrine falcon. Then, immerse yourself in the stories of the American west during a tour of the Museum of the Mountain West, a preserved and re-created pioneer town that captures life as it was over a century ago. Return to Grand Junction for an evening at leisure. (B, L)

Day 5: Tuesday, August 11, 2026: Grand Junction - Silverton - Durango - Head south to Silverton, a former silver mining town and now a National Historic Landmark. Hidden high in the San Juan Mountains, this town blends spectacular scenery, Victorian charm and historic architecture. Then it’s “all aboard” the Durango & Silverton Narrow Gauge Railroad. This 1881 coal-fired, steam-powered locomotive made its name hauling silver and gold ore from the San Juan Mountains, but you will soon realize it is the view that is its most precious asset. (B)

Day 6: Wednesday, August 12, 2026: Durango - Mesa Verde National Park - Durango - An incredible day awaits in Mesa Verde National Park (UNESCO), home of the ancient Ancestral Puebloan civilization. Join a local guide on a drive through the park making several photo stops including views of the famous Spruce Tree House, one of Mesa Verde’s best preserved cliff dwellings and Cliff Palace, the largest in the park. This evening, experience a farm-to-table dinner on a family-owned ranch surrounded by red mountain peaks and lush green pastures. (B, D)

Day 7: Thursday, August 13, 2026: Durango - Colorado Springs - Sit back and relax during a scenic ride to Colorado Springs. En route, marvel at the landscape as you make your way from the San Juan National Forest and across Wolf Creek Pass, a section of the Continental Divide that would take pioneers two to three weeks to cross. Continue on through the Rio Grande National Forest, a vast expanse of wilderness named for the 1,800 miles of Rio Grande River that cuts through the forest. Your day concludes in Colorado Springs, an artistic and cultural hub. (B)

Day 8: Friday, August 14, 2026: Colorado Springs - Manitou Springs - Colorado Springs - Depart for Manitou Springs, home of Pikes Peak – the legendary symbol of the 1859 Gold Rush. Embark on a journey aboard the Pikes Peak Cog Railway, the world’s highest cog railroad, for an 8.9 mile trip to the top of Pikes Peak. During the journey you will see magnificent views and perhaps animals in their native habitat. Later, travel to the Garden of the Gods to take in the view of towering sandstone formations that dot the landscape set in the backdrop of majestic Pikes Peak. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner and celebrate your adventure. (B, D)

10 Day 9: Saturday, August 15, 2026: Colorado Springs - Tour Ends - Your tour comes to a close in Colorado Springs.
