# WHAT IS SB 1383?

Senate Bill 1383 is groundbreaking California legislation designed to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by mandating the diversion of organic waste from landfills.

All Californians are now required to divert food scraps, landscape debris, wood, clean and food-soiled paper, and cardboard from landfills.



Senate Bill 1383 sets two main diversion targets for the year 2025. These include:

- Reducing the amount of organic waste going to landfills by 75%
- Rescuing a minimum of 20% of surplus edible food from landfills to help feed Californians who are food insecure

# WHY IS ORGANIC WASTE SUCH A BIG DEAL?

- 20% of the atmospheric methane in California is attributed to the emissions caused by landfilling organic waste.
- Methane is a super greenhouse gas with 84 times the heat trapping potential of carbon dioxide.
- Organic waste like food scraps, yard trimmings, paper, and cardboard currently make up more than 50% of the waste in California landfills.



Implementing Senate Bill 1383 will reduce methane emissions and is essential to achieving California's greenhouse gas emission reductions goals.

# HOW DIVERTING ORGANIC WASTE HELPS

- When organic waste is diverted to make compost, methane emissions and other air pollutants are prevented or significantly reduced.
- When applied to soil, compost removes carbon dioxide from the atmosphere while improving the soil's nutrient content and ability to retain moisture and withstand wildfires.
- Biofuels are a byproduct of the composting process and are a cleaner alternative to fossil fuels.
- Redirecting edible food to help feed the nearly 1 in 4 Californians who are food insecure is a win-win!

# YOUR ORGANICS COLLECTION SERVICES

**SENATE BILL 1383 REQUIRES ALL RESIDENTS, BUSINESSES, AND SCHOOLS TO PROPERLY SORT ORGANIC WASTE INTO THE CORRECT CONTAINERS.**

Senate Bill 1383 defines organic waste as solid waste containing material originating from living organisms including food, landscape debris, organic textiles such as cotton, wool & other animal hair, wood and lumber, paper, and manure. While some organic waste can't be placed in your organics bin (clothing and rugs, large pieces of lumber), much of the organic waste generated in businesses and homes can.

## ORGANICS BIN ORGANICS

- Food scraps
- Landscape trimmings
- Livestock manure (no dog or cat waste)
- Animal hair
- Shredded paper (no colored or glossy paper)
- Small scraps of clean wood and lumber
- Coffee grounds and paper coffee filters
- Food-soiled paper/cardboard (ex: paper towels and greasy pizza boxes)



Please never place plastic bags in your organics bin. Only use paper and other ASTM D6400 rated compostable bags for your bagged organic waste.

Yolo County has two waste haulers that service the majority of residential, business, and apartment properties: WM & Recology Davis. If you need to modify your recycling or organics collection services, you can contact your waste hauler.

# BIN REQUIREMENTS

Businesses, schools, and organizations must provide customers and employees with adequate access to trash, recycling, and organics bins. These trash, recycling, and organic waste bins must be easily accessible, visible, and clearly marked with signage on what can and cannot be placed into each bin.

A goal of Senate Bill 1383 is to have consistent waste stream color coding throughout California.

All new waste containers must be either color coded OR properly labeled as such:



## COLOR REQUIREMENTS

- Bin lids and/or body must be color-coded:

**ORGANICS**

**TRASH**

**RECYCLING**

- Existing bins do not need to be replaced until 2036.



## LABEL REQUIREMENTS

Bins must be clearly labeled with what can and cannot go inside.

# EDUCATION

In order to ensure that everyone knows how to sort their waste into the correct bin, Senate Bill 1383 regulations require annual education about how to sort waste properly.



## RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY REQUIREMENTS

Property owners and/or managers of residential rental properties must:

- Annually educate employees and tenants on how to properly sort recycling and organic waste into the correct bins.
- Provide information to new tenants within 14 days of move-in date.

## BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS

Businesses and organizations must:

- Annually educate employees, contractors, customers, and tenants on how to properly sort recyclables and organic waste into the correct bins.
- Provide information to new tenants within 14 days of occupation of the premises.
- Periodically inspect recycling and organics bins for contamination.
- Inform employees if bins are contaminated.
- Provide trash, recycling, and organics containers accurately colored and labeled, and available to their employees and patrons.



All residents should receive information about proper waste sorting every year, either from their recycling program, local jurisdiction, waste hauler, property manager, or landlord. Residents should share this waste sorting information with families, friends, and house mates.

# CONTAMINATION MONITORING

**Monitoring bins for contamination is an essential part of achieving waste diversion goals.**



**Did you know contamination from one home or business can send a whole truck load of recycling or organic material to the landfill?**

Contamination—when something is placed in the wrong bin, such as putting trash into a recycling bin—can be a serious problem for recycling programs.

Keeping recycling and organic waste streams properly sorted will help ensure that material can be recycled and composted into usable products.

To reduce contamination, businesses, organizations, and schools must periodically:

- Inspect organic waste containers for contamination
- Inform employees if containers are contaminated
- Instruct employees (and students) how to properly sort material into the correct containers.

# FOOD RECOVERY: ADDRESSING FOOD INSECURITY

Food recovery is the best use for surplus food and a vital way for California to conserve resources, prevent unnecessary waste, and feed hungry people.

To reduce food waste and help address food insecurity, Senate Bill 1383 requires the following:

- Jurisdictions must establish food recovery programs and strengthen their existing food recovery networks, when needed.
- Certain businesses\* must arrange to recover the maximum amount of their surplus food that would otherwise go to landfills.
- Food recovery organizations and services that participate in SB 1383 food recovery must maintain comprehensive records and are subject to compliance inspections.

All food donations and distributions must meet the food safety requirements of the California Retail Food Code.

## **\*Which businesses are required to recover surplus food under the Senate Bill 1383 regulations?**

- Starting January 2022: grocery stores, supermarkets, food distributors, food service providers, and wholesale food vendors.
- Starting January 2024: some restaurants, hotels, health facilities, and schools.



# CLOSING THE LOOP

## Benefits of compost application

The Yolo County Central Landfill sells compost made from organic waste from local jurisdictions. Compost application is a natural way to remove carbon dioxide from the atmosphere at a relatively low financial cost. Compost increases the soil nutrient content, productivity, and its ability to retain moisture and form stable carbon. Research has found that a one-time application of compost can increase the soil's carbon content continually for decades to come.

Yolo County residents are eligible for free compost at the Yolo County Central Landfill during spring and fall compost give away events!





# HOLIDAY WASTE REDUCTION TIPS

It's the most wonderful time of the year, but the weeks between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day are also notorious for high volumes of waste. More than 5 million tons of additional waste is generated nationwide during this period. This equates to a 3 fold increase in food waste generation.

The good news is there are many festive ways to reduce waste during the holidays without cutting back on the good cheer.

- Plan out how much food you and your guests will realistically need, and stock up accordingly. The [Save the Food \(SaveTheFood.com\)](https://www.savethefood.com) organization has a tool called "The Guest-Imator" to help you estimate how much food you need to keep your guests happy and healthy! If you do have leftovers, send each guest home with a doggie bag.
- Consider adopting meal prepping practices as your New Year's resolution.
  - What's meal prepping? It's a plan that helps you cook 3-5 days worth of meals at one time. The idea is you have ready-to-go meals throughout the week and hopefully nothing to waste at the end.
  - Why? It helps to reduce food waste, saves time and money, and may help you eat healthier.
  - Start by picking a day to prep your meals. Sunday is a popular pick.
  - Next, check your refrigerator, freezer, and pantry. See what needs to be used up, and then think of a dish or dishes to make with those items. Add any of the missing ingredients to your shopping list.
  - Include "building block" ingredients in your shopping list. These are basic main ingredients that can be incorporated into most meals and snacks.
  - Use your refrigerator and freezer to store individually portioned meals until you're ready to eat.
